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Summary and Guidelines

The ENHANCE-911 Act was enacted to improve, enhance, and promote the nation's homeland security, public safety, and citizen activated emergency response capabilities. This will be accomplished through the use of enhanced 911 services to further upgrade Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) capabilities and related functions in receiving E-911 calls; and to support the construction and operation of ubiquitous and reliable citizen-activated systems.

Application Instructions

Please read the following before completing and submitting the ENHANCED 911 GRANT APPLICATION.

1. All certifications must be received in hard copy with an original signature.
2. Submit the grant application narrative and the attached forms typed or word processed.
3. Please submit Federal Standard Form 424 (SF-424 A and B Non-Construction): This is a standard form (including the continuation sheets) required for use as a cover sheet for submission of pre-applications and applications and related information under discretionary programs. Additional information and forms can be located at: http://www.grants.gov/agencies/aapproved_standard_forms.jsp.
4. As a pre-condition to receiving federal funding, all contractors and grantees must first be registered in the Federal Government's Central Contractor Registration (CCR.) Registration in the CCR allows for payments via Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT). To register (if not already done so), contractors and grantees should visit the following web address and click on "Start New Registration;" www.ccr.gov. To register, contractors and grantees must have the following information:
 - Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number provided by Dun and Bradstreet.
 - Tax Identification Number (TIN) and Taxpayer Name used in federal tax matters.
 - Demographical and statistical information about the contractor's or grantee's organization.

- EFT information for payment of invoices (e.g., ABA Routing Number of bank, Account Number) It is requested that, to ensure the appropriate business entity's invoices are reimbursed, any Application for Federal Assistance include the appropriate DUNS number.
